Why is it significant?:

The Heritage Council may enter a place in the Heritage Register if it meets one or more of the following criteria from the Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995:

- a) The place is important to the course or pattern of Tasmania's history.
- b) The place possesses uncommon or rare aspects of Tasmania's history.
- c) The place has the potential to yield information that will contribute to an understanding of Tasmania's history.
- d) The place is important in demonstrating the principal characteristics of a class of place in Tasmania's history.

Marchwiel is of historic heritage significance because of its ability to demonstrate the principal characteristics of a Victorian Farm complex comprising a range of building types typical of the period .
- e) The place is important in demonstrating a high degree of creative or technical achievement.

- f) The place has a strong or special association with a particular community or cultural group for social or spiritual reasons.
- g) The place has a special association with the life or works of a person, or group of persons, of importance in Tasmania's history.
- h) The place is important in exhibiting particular aesthetic characteristics.
